- Responsible for
 - the academic and social cooperation of the class
 - coordinating written assignments

 - monitors the students' physical and written absence
 - decides which initiatives should be put in place

The Teachers' Team...

- Supports the academic and social well-being of the class
- Works together to evaluate the teaching of individual subjects as well as cross-curricular teaching

The Student Counsellor

- Part-time position: 6 for the stx students and 1 for the Pre-IB & IB students (AW)
- Supports the Team Leaders and the IB Coordinator to help students achieve the best possible outcome of their education
- Gives individual as well as group advice on relevant academic, personal, social and economic issues
- Offers contact to psychologist and dyslexia support
- Individual consultations with all Pre-IB students about his or her academic and social well-being as well as discussing in detail potential subject choices in the IB Diploma Programme prior to IB application
