The Teachers' Team

- ▶ The Team Leaders and the Student Counsellor
 - ▶ monitor the students' physical and written absence
 - ▶ decide which initiatives should be put in place
 - ▶ most pre-IB teachers are part of the Team
- ▶ Supports the development of students' study skills
- ▶ Plans cross-curricular collaboration for the school year
- ▶ Supports the academic and social well-being of the class
- ▶ Works together to evaluate the teaching of individual subjects as well as cross-curricular teaching

IT Policy

Computers are required and must be brought to school every day

- ▶ Computers/laptops and tablets are brought to class as working tools and are used at the discretion of the teacher

School provide MS Office for all students

- ▶ Mobile phones must be on silent and placed in “*Mobile Hotel*” or in bag during teaching
- ▶ Inappropriate use gives the teacher the right to:
 - ▶ ask the individual student to close the computer
 - ▶ confiscate a mobile phone for the duration of the class
 - ▶ dismiss a student from the module - the student will then be registered as absent
 - ▶ In especially severe cases the Team Leader may issue an official written warning

The Student Counsellor

- ▶ **Lone Jeppesen:** Student Counsellor for the Pre-IB and IB students
- ▶ Supports the Team Leaders and the IB Coordinator to help students achieve the best possible outcome of their education
- ▶ Gives individual as well as group advice on relevant academic, personal, social and financial issues
- ▶ Offers pastoral care and contact to professional outside support
- ▶ Individual consultations with all Pre-IB students about their academic and social well-being. Scheduled appointments discussing and advising on potential subject choices prior to the IB Diploma Programme (IB DP) application on 1 March 2024

Adapting to the demands of the Pre-IB

What to expect:

- ▶ Responsibility for own study skills
- ▶ Need for independence, dedication and perseverance
- ▶ Workload (homework: approx. 2-3 hours a day, also weekends)
- ▶ Less free time for friends, after-school jobs etc.
- ▶ Potential initial grade drop is not unusual
- ▶ Short adjustment period to new school
- ▶ Qualification for IB DP by 1 March 2024

Focus on social integration

- ▶ Buddy groups established on the first day of school
- ▶ IB Student Counsellor session on how to overcome hurdles and thrive at a new school
- ▶ Intro Trip and Sports Day with a focus on team building
- ▶ Modules with the Team Leader about classroom culture
- ▶ Individual consultations with the Student
- ▶ GENERAL: Contact Team Leader or Student Counsellor at any time!

The Introductory Programme

Intro days focusing on social integration:

- ▶ First three days: Academic and social activities with the team leader, the teachers' team and the student tutors
- ▶ Establishing buddy groups

Intro trip 11-12 September (mandatory):

- ▶ A two-day (one night) trip to Roskilde, Denmark.
- ▶ Staying in single-sex shared rooms in a hostel
- ▶ Sightseeing and team-building activities
- ▶ Cost DKK 500 + lunch and dinner costs
- ▶ Fun and bonding 😊

Organisation of courses

August - October

AP: "Almen Sprogforståelse" (General Linguistics course)

- ▶ Part of the Danish core curriculum
- ▶ Individual written test at the end of October

NV: "Naturvidenskabeligt Grundforløb" (General Science course)

- ▶ Part of the Danish core curriculum
- ▶ Individual oral test at the end of October
